What is Title I ?

- Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child.
- The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year.

How Title I works

- The federal government provides funding to states each year for Title I
- The New Jersey Department of Education sends the money to the districts.
- The school district identifies eligible schools and provides Title I funds.

Student Selection

- Students are selected based on multiple criteria...
- Report Card Grades
- Standardized Testing Scores such as NJ ASK
- MAP Testing or Benchmark Assessments
- Parent/Teacher Recommendation

Title I Programs Provide Supplemental Support

- Small Group Setting Pull Out or Push In Assistance
- Additional Basic Skills Teacher
- A variety of supplemental teaching methods and materials
- Emphasis on Reading, Writing and Mathematic Skills

Working Together

- Title I law requires that all Title I schools and families work together.

- Basic Skills Progress Reports
